Seniors May Donate and Save Taxes

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to St. Monica Church from your IRA could reduce your 2024 Taxable Income!

- · You must be at least 70½ when you request a QCD.
- Funds must be transferred directly from your IRA custodian to St Monica Church.
- A QCD will count toward your 2024 Required Minimum Distribution if the funds come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline (generally December 31 each year).



Creation Corner

As you ponder what resolution to make for 2025, how about one that involves cleaner living? By that, we mean "greener cleaning": using cleaning products that don't contain harmful ingredients for you or the environment. Many manufacturers of household cleaners don't disclose all ingredients on product labels and are not required by law to do so, according to the Environmental Working Group. So why not resolve in 2025 to make your own cleaners? Here are some tips from EWG.

All-purpose cleaners: Mix hot water with $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of washing soda (a cleaning agent more abrasive than baking soda) and $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of liquid soap or dish detergent.

Kitchen cleaners: Mix vinegar and salt into a paste to produce a grime-fighting surface cleaner. For oven stains, sprinkle baking soda on them, moisten with water, let stand overnight, wipe and rinse. Skip using commercial oven cleaners that can burn your skin, eyes and lungs.

Bathroom cleaners: To create a soft scrub for surfaces, wet $\frac{1}{2}$ cup baking soda with a little liquid soap to get a frosting-like consistency. For stubborn stains, try oxygen (color-safe) bleaches. Wear gloves.

Avoid these three categories:

- · Bleach and quat-based(quaternary ammonium compound ((QAC)) disinfectants that can cause respiratory issues.
- · Air fresheners that contain undisclosed chemicals. Open windows instead.
- Caustic drain cleaners. Make a fizzy drain cleaner with $1\!\!\!/_2$ cup baking soda and $1\!\!\!/_2$ cup vinegar.

Download the free EWG app, and use it to scan bar codes to get the EWG ratings of products. The scanner also works on the bar codes of food products and rates those.
