Over the past few months, our finance team, pastoral council (formerly facilitation team), development team, and staff team have worked to inform the parish that with the projected numbers, St. Monica has about 5 more years of financial solvency. With the collection in the red every week (see page 3), it is increasingly important for us to plan ahead and take measures to ensure the future of our beloved parish. Each of us can help, and there are many ways to do so:

Seniors May Donate and Save Taxes

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to St. Monica Church from your IRA could reduce your 2024 Taxable Income!

- · You must be at least 70½ when you request a QCD.
- Funds must be transferred directly from your IRA custodian to St Monica Church.
- A QCD will count toward your 2024 Required Minimum Distribution if the funds come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline (generally December 31 each year).



Creation Corner

Finding Calm in the Chaos

Aaahhh, Advent. That time of quiet preparation when we are invited to go deeply into our inner room and prepare for Love itself to become incarnate in our hearts and our world. Quiet evenings around the Advent wreath, basking in the candles' warm glow ...

Not so much, eh?

More like scrambling around finding presents, driving kids to concerts and rehearsals, figuring out what on earth to give that relative you only see once a year, hiding presents, baking, more baking, figuring out how to fit everyone around the table...it can be a pretty frenetic time.

So here is an early Christmas gift for you. Something that can help you find calm in the midst of uproar, whether it's the pre-Christmas heebie-jeebies or something more serious: waiting for test results, worrying about the job, a sick relative, or just the general misery of so much of the world.

It's a prayer you may have heard of. Someone found it on a piece of paper in St. Teresa of Avila's prayer book. She was so close to God, but at the same time she lived in a whirlpool of stressful labor, journeying and struggle. Many people have found "St. Teresa's Bookmark" a powerful way to turn their hearts to God and find that ability to trust, to love, to abide in the Love which sustains us no matter what is happening.

It is powerful. But don't just recite it: if you memorize it and mentally time it with your breath as you repeat it, you'll find that it has great power to bring you back to that center where the Spirit dwells within you. You can say it while sitting for prayer, while walking, when you wake with the 4am heebie-jeebies... Let it breathe you, so to speak, for at least 10 minutes, or until you fall back asleep, or until you feel its power in your heart.

Let nothing upset you.
Let nothing alarm you.
All things are passing.
God alone is changeless.
Patient endurance
attains what it strives for.
Whoever has God
is lacking for nothing.
God alone
is enough.

May you have a blessed Advent and a bright and beautiful Christmas.
