

Creation Corner

"Blue Zones" are areas of the world where people live the longest. Dan Buettner has spent 20 years visiting and interviewing centenarians living in these zones. He has learned something he didn't expect. "When you take worldwide data on happiness, and you control for everything else, you find that people who live next to water are happier than people who don't."

Theories vary about why this is. "It may be the tranquilizing effect of water or that the climate is moderated because of the water, but it seems to make us happier. And happiness isn't the only positive side-effect of living by the water." A review of several studies found "that spending time near coasts, lakes or rivers can promote health and well-being and prevent disease."

We in our area have received many of her gifts from our Sister Water. A Great Lake, a beautiful river and the spectacular Finger Lakes are all within a short distance. Let's make the time to visit with one or all these treasures and be refreshed and renewed and made happier by them.

Scholarships for Catholic School Students

Our parish grants awards to students registered in Catholic schools in Grades K-8:

- Students in Grades K 4 can receive \$1000 each year.
- Students in Grades 5 8 can receive \$500 each year.
- Current scholars in Grades 9 12 can continue their awards of \$1000 each year. No new awards will be granted to high school students.

To request a grant, you must be a registered parishioner. Contact Barbara Higgins by July 15 at 563-7447 or higgins@alum.rpi.edu and provide the name of student, the grade, and the school. This information must be provided each year. No financial information is needed.

St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

The Light of Christ's presence shines brightly at neighborhood institutions that continue to serve residents for decades.

The **Thurston Road YMCA Neighborhood Center** at 597
Thurston Road offers FREE chilled take-home meals to the public 6 days a week. Monday through Friday find meals from 6 AM to 12
PM, and 5 PM to 8 PM. Saturday meals are available 9 AM to 1 PM.



Meals are pre-packaged by Foodlink. Their goal is to expand food access to quality, nutritious

meals using relationships with organizations like the YMCA that work with multi-generational families.
