Creation Corner

Often, in this column, we talk about how natural products are much more beneficial to the environment than those containing chemicals and especially those with oil derivatives and plastics. We also encourage buying locally whenever possible. Well, Jennifer Kelly checks all the boxes. This summer, Jennifer, owner of Fiddlehead Farm, has been one of the vendors at the Farmer's Market. She started her company as a beekeeper and she now has 10 producing hives. You can get her honey, which she collects twice a year, (the spring honey is in season) at the market.

But Jennifer has branched into producing other natural products. These include bar soap and shampoo bars which she makes herself. Her own apple cider vinegar goes into the shampoo bars. She also has dish soap with ingredients such as olive and coconut oils and castor oil with eucalyptus and orange fragrances. She produces powdered laundry soap and a beautiful beeswax salve. And in her spare time, she crochets natural fiber dishcloths. If you can't catch her at the market, her products are available at Upstate Village Market in Brockport and online at fiddleheadllc.com.
