

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



Creation Corner

This week and next, we're going to look at clothing, something we all use every day. What goes into it, does it do any harm to our world, what can we do to reduce any damage?

Do you know that 60% of our clothes are made of plastic? And the majority of that is virgin plastic. Polyester accounts for about 52% of synthetic fabrics with nylon and acrylic comprising most of the rest. These fabrics are popular because they are cheap and versatile but they come at a considerable environmental cost. Globally, around 100 billion items of clothing are produced each year (that's over 12 items for each individual on the planet) and most of these end up being tossed out, landing in a landfill.

These fabrics are all derived from fossil fuels. Production of the synthetics requires use of toxic chemicals and heavy metals, large amounts of energy and water. A special dye, which intoxicates animals, plants and the dye workers is required to color polyester. None of the fabrics is degradable, taking from 30 to 300 years to decompose. And while it's in use, the clothing must be washed, releasing microplastics into the water, eventually ending up in lakes, rivers and oceans.

So, what will help? First, keep the clothes you already have. They're not in a landfill. Ask yourself whether the item needs to be washed each time it is worn. When washing synthetics especially, you can use a washing bag or a Cora ball, both of which will trap a large percentage of the microfibers. When new clothes are necessary, try to buy second-hand or buy a sustainable brand. Look at the quality of the garment. Is it made to last, or will it only hold up for a short period?

Next week, we'll look at clothing's end of life.
