Creation Corner

Do you wonder if one person can really make a difference when it comes to climate change? There is one area where individual choices make a concrete difference — our food choices. One sector of the food system has an outsized environmental impact, and that's animal agriculture.

Animals like cows and sheep burp methane, which is 28 times more potent than CO2. Their feces produces nitrous oxide, a greenhouse gas 256 times more potent than CO2. The Environmental Working Group found that if everyone in the U.S. ate no meat or cheese just one day per week, it would be like not driving 91 billion miles. As demand for meat goes down, so does the number of animals raised on factory farms.

Legumes – peanuts, beans, lentils and peas – and foods made from them are high in protein. Here's an easy to make black bean and corn salad that's a tasty and filling option for a summer picnic.

Black Bean and Corn Salad

- 1 15-ounce can black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 can corn, rinsed and drained
- 1 large red bell pepper, diced
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- ¼ cup chopped onion
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- Juice of two lemons
- ¾ cup of chopped fresh cilantro

Mix all ingredients thoroughly. Refrigerate mixture for a few hours or overnight for all the ingredients to blend. Source: onceuponachef.com.
