Panhandling in Our Neighborhood

If you have been to St. Monica's, you have likely encountered someone in the church or parking lot asking for money. We want to maintain human dignity in our interactions with others and be welcoming to all, AND we want to be cognizant of our ministry boundaries. Parishioners have been asked to refrain from giving out money for several reasons, including:

- Ministerial boundaries: Giving money is not a sustainable ministry that St. Monica's can offer. There are other organizations that are set up to help people in this way. We do not want to encourage repeated visits to ask for money or word getting around that "St. Monica's gives out money," especially when youth or vulnerable adults are present.
- <u>Safety:</u> We have several programs for youth that operate in our spaces, and any present adults require *Creating a Safe Environment (CASE)* training.
- <u>Background knowledge:</u> In most cases, the staff knows our neighbors and their situations, and many are connected with appropriate service organizations.

If someone asks for money, please:

- 1. Respond with kindness while maintaining the boundary: "I'm sorry, but we are not able to give out money here."
- 2. You may invite them to stay for Mass or coffee hour if applicable.
- 3. You may offer information about other organizations that can help if you are familiar with those organizations.
- 4. Inform a staff member so we can reinforce the boundary and connect them with appropriate services, if applicable.

For further information, speak with any of the parish staff. Let's work together to ensure that every person experiences safety and dignity at St. Monica's. Thank you!

Scholarships for Catholic School Students

Our parish grants awards to students registered in Catholic schools in Grades K-8:

- Students in Grades K 4 can receive \$1000 each year.
- Students in Grades 5 8 can receive \$500 each year.
- Current scholars in Grades 9 12 can continue their awards of \$1000 each year. No new awards will be granted to high school students.

To request a grant, you must be a registered parishioner. Contact Barbara Higgins by July 15 at 563-7447 or higgins@alum.rpi.edu and provide the name of student, the grade, and the school. This information must be provided each year. No financial information is needed.
