Creation Corner

Plastics

Remember the career advice Dustin Hoffman received in *The Graduate* (the advice was one word: "Plastics.")? Fast-forward 50 years and we are all aware of the Texas-sized plastic island floating in the Pacific Ocean. So, hope is not the word that jumps to mind at the mention of plastic. But, surprisingly, even here there is hope to be had.

ByFusion is a California company which produces a machine that converts any plastic waste, including non-recyclable plastic, into cinder-block sized building blocks. Boise, Idaho, is partnering with ByFusion in a project demonstrating the usefulness of the product. The plastic blocks are being used to build structures in a local park. Boise residents can see where their recycling is going - and it's not into a landfill.

According to ByFusion's founder, Heidi Kijawa, the process creates zero emissions. "It's only steam and compression. We don't sort, we don't clean. We just literally take the plastic waste, throw it in the machine, make a block and throw it in a wall." KTVB7, Boise, Idaho

Another company, Newlight Technologies, is removing methane from the air and generating a product with the potential to reduce plastic use. The company sources methane from landfills, coal mines and agricultural digesters. The methane is pumped through a bioreactor filled with microorganisms that feed on the gas. They grow and start to build up this product, which the company calls AirCarbon, inside their cells. It is then extracted, purified, and melted into pellets. These pellets form the basis for a nature-based, environmentally degradable polymer that can replace oil-based plastics. Some available products using AirCarbon are sunglasses, wallets, drinking straws and cutlery. Fast Company

Ohio State scientists have developed a plastic from natural rubber. This new plastic has the potential for use in food packaging. It is bio-degradable and is strong enough to withstand the demands of shipping, handling, microwaving, and freezing. The researchers are looking at other materials to make the product stronger. These include tomato skins, eggshells and even invasive grasses being removed from waterways. dw.com

Other source materials being explored or already in production as alternatives to petroleum-based plastic were too many to include in this column. Some include olive pits (from Turkey), sunflower husks (Germany), fish processing waste - skin and scales (UK), plant-based sugars (Netherlands), and mushrooms (US). Hope indeed.
