## What can you do to "Break Free from Plastics"?

In the spirit of Franciscan simplicity of living and poverty of possessions, the first and foremost question is, "Do I really need this product?" Be aware of personal WANTS versus NEEDS.

To reduce your exposure and personal consumption of plastics, here are a few suggestions/reminders.

# <u>Use plastic substitutes for food, beverages, and household</u> items:

- Eat more fresh foods to avoid plastic packaging
- Replace plastic with glass food storage containers in your home
- Use metal and glass containers for water bottles (your reusable water bottles are saving hundreds of single use bottles/year from going into the landfill)
- Use non-plastic containers for microwaving food/beverages
- Take your own fabric shopping bags (ex. mesh cloth) for produce
- use cloth instead of plastic tablecloths at events
- replace cling-film with Beeswax Wrap
- use bars of soap/shampoo & conditioner instead of plastic pump bottles
- use laundry sheets or powder free of plastics

#### Other suggestions:

- Try to avoid walking on the side of a roadway, reducing exposure to tire wear-down emissions from roads more information: https://thetyrecollective.com
- Decline the thermal printed receipts when asked after purchases
- Opt for natural fabrics and clothing such as cotton, silk, and wool--made of animal or plant-based fibers
- Prioritize wet dusting and vacuuming

## St. Monica Neighborhood Businesses

Jesus, who is my neighbor?

Here is a 2nd generation neighborhood business that continues to serve St. Monica's community 68 years after it first opened on Genesee Street. In fact, it is Rochester's oldest sporting goods store!



Jim Dalberth Sporting Goods at 925 Genesee St. has been a fixture in the neighborhood since 1956. It specializes in footwear, apparel, and equipment for competitive runners. Customers include high school and college track teams in a 3-county area.

Dalberth's also supplies youth sports teams – including St. Monica CYO basketball - at pricing well below the major retailers.
