



# Creation Corner

## "Break Free from Plastics" for Your Health

- Over 98% of plastics are made from fossil carbons such as oil and gas. Thousands of petrochemical additives are used to make plastics.
- Many are "chemicals of concern" and considered highly toxic, including carcinogens.
- Plastics don't biodegrade; they break down into smaller and smaller particles called micro- and nano plastics.
- Researchers have found these particles almost everywhere they have looked, including inside the human body. Particles have been found in lung tissue, intestinal tissue, blood, breast milk, heart muscle, and both sides of the placenta - including fetuses and newborn babies.

Plastic particles get caught up into the food we eat, the air we breathe, the water we drink.

There are three key routes plastic particles enter our body:

- Ingestion Food: through packaging containing food, water, and other beverages.
- 2. Inhalation Air:
  - a. Indoors from synthetic clothing (man-made containing PFA and other chemicals), furniture fabrics, and in household dust.
  - b. Outdoors: airborne fertilizer, ocean waves, roadway emissions generated wear down of tires on vehicles, and in urban and heavily-polluted areas.
- Dermal Skin: cosmetic and personal care products including variety make-up and perfumes, scented lotions, hair care, sunscreen, toothpaste, soap, deodorants, household cleaners and detergents, and thermal printed receipts.

What can we do? Over the next 2 weeks, the Creation Corner will provide suggestions you can take to reduce your exposure and break free from plastics.
